



CEO Colorado Springs - Voter Registration Guide

In Colorado, You're Eligible to Vote if:

- You are *not* currently in state prison or federal prison for a felony conviction.
- You *can* vote at the completion of your prison term. You *can* vote if you are still on probation or parole.
- You *can* vote and register to vote if you are in jail awaiting trial or serving a sentence for a misdemeanor conviction.
- Check with your parole officer or you can check if you're eligible to vote online at <https://campaignlegal.org/restoreyourvote>
- You're a United States citizen and a resident of Colorado and the county, city, or village for at least 22 days before Election Day
- You're at least 18 years old on Election Day
- You are not found mentally incompetent to vote by a court
- Due to voter rolls being purged, sometimes individuals who are eligible and registered to vote are removed. You can check whether you're still registered to vote <https://www.vote.org/am-i-registered-to-vote/>

Where and How to Register to Vote in El Paso County

To register online:

You can register to vote online at

- To register online you will need your Colorado driver license or Colorado identification card number, the last four digits of your social security number, and your date of birth.

- Colorado allows in person voter registration and voting up until 7PM on Election Day. However, make sure you mail your registration form **at least 8 days before** the election to be mailed a ballot. Mail the registration form to the El Paso County Board of Elections at

Where and When to Vote in Colorado Springs

- The 2020 Presidential election will take place on **Tuesday, November 3rd**, but you can mail your ballot any time from the time you receive it until Election Day.
- You can vote in person or by mail before Election Day. If you registered at least 8 days before Election Day, you will automatically be mailed a ballot. Otherwise, you can find the nearest place to vote at <https://www.sos.state.co.us/voter/pages/pub/olvr/findVoterReg.xhtml>.

Additional Information

- If you have already registered to vote but have since moved, be sure to re-register at your new address.
- Under Colorado State law, you are eligible for up to two hours of paid time off to vote, unless you have three non-work hours available when the polls are open. Alternatively, you can vote by mail.
