



CEO Harrisburg - Voter Registration Guide



In Pennsylvania, You're Eligible to Vote if:

- You are convicted/incarcerated for a misdemeanor (absentee)
- You were convicted of a felony but not incarcerated at the time of the election
- You are under house arrest (absentee)
- You are on parole or probation
- You are incarcerated awaiting trial (absentee)
- If you are in a halfway house not on pre-release status you can vote
 - You can check if you're eligible to vote online at [Restore Your Vote](#)
- You're a United States citizen and a resident of Pennsylvania for at least 30 days
- You're at least 18 years old on Election Day
- You are not found mentally incompetent to vote by a court

Where and How to Register to Vote in Harrisburg

To register online:

You can register to vote online 15 days before an election at

<https://www.pavoterservices.pa.gov/Pages/VoterRegistrationApplication.aspx>

- To register online you will need your Driver License number, PennDOT ID or the last four digits of your social security number.
 - If you do not provide a PennDOT ID you will need to provide a signature by the registration date

To register by mail:

- Your registration must be postmarked by October 19 (15 days before the election) and sent to your local county election office

Where and When to Vote in Harrisburg

- The 2020 Presidential election will take place on **Tuesday, November 3rd** 7:00am to 8:00 pm.
 - If you are in line by 8:00 pm you can vote even if it's later than 8:01 pm! (Don't leave the line)
- You can vote in person or by mail before Election Day. You can find the nearest place to vote at https://www.dauphincounty.org/government/departments/elections_and_voter_registration/polling_places/index.php
- If you vote by mail, you need to submit an application for a mail-in ballot. You can find more information at <https://www.votespa.com/Voting-in-PA/Pages/Mail-and-Absentee-Ballot.aspx>.
 - Your county election office must receive the application by October 27 at 5pm.
 - VOTED BALLOTS must be RECEIVED by your county election office by **November 3 at 8 pm** - postmarks are not enough
