



# CEO Louisville - Voter Registration Guide



## In Kentucky, You're Eligible to Vote if:

- You *can* vote if you have been released from prison after a misdemeanor conviction.
- You *can* vote if you have completed parole and probation for a non-violent felony.
- You *can* vote if you do not have any pending felony charges at the time of your discharge from parole/probation.
- Check with your parole officer or you can check if you're eligible to vote online at <https://campaignlegal.org/restoreyourvote>
- You're a United States citizen and a resident of Kentucky and the county, city, or village for at least 30 days before Election Day
- You're at least 18 years old on Election Day
- You are not found mentally incompetent to vote by a court
- Due to voter rolls being purged, sometimes individuals who are eligible and registered to vote are removed. You can check whether you're still registered to vote <https://www.vote.org/am-i-registered-to-vote/>

## Where and How to Register to Vote in Jefferson County

You can register to vote online at <https://vrsws.sos.ky.gov/ovrweb/>:

- To register online you will need your Kentucky driver license or Kentucky identification card number, the last four digits of your social security number, and your date of birth. You will need to submit this registration form at least 30 days before the election.

You can register to vote by mail using this form,

- You need to sign and mail the voter registration form **at least 30 days before** Election Day. Mail the registration form to the Erie County Board of Elections at  
70 West Ormsby Ave, STE 301  
Louisville, KY 40203-3143
- If you will need your ballot mailed to you, you will need to submit a request through one of the ways found on this website:

## Where and When to Vote in Louisville

- The 2020 Presidential election will take place on **Tuesday, November 3rd.**
- You can vote in person or by mail before Election Day. You can find the nearest place to vote at <http://jeffersoncountyclerk.org/wheredoivote/>.
- If you vote by mail, you need to mail the ballot at least 7 days before Election Day **(This means that if you plan to vote by mail, you need to mail in your ballot by Tuesday, October 27th in order for your vote to be counted.)**

## Additional Information

- If you have already registered to vote but have since moved, be sure to re-register at your new address.
- Under Kentucky State law, you are entitled to “reasonable time off” of work to vote, which cannot be less than 4 hours. This time off is unpaid, and proof of voting will be required by your employer. Otherwise, you can apply to vote by mail.
