



CEO California - Voter Registration Guide



In California, You're Eligible to Vote if:

- You are not in state prison or federal prison for a felony conviction
 - You can vote if you're in county jail, or on parole, probation, mandatory supervision, post-release community supervision, or federal supervised release
 - You can check if you're eligible to vote online at [Restore Your Vote](#)
- You're a United States citizen and a resident of California
- You're at least 18 years old on Election Day
- You are not found mentally incompetent to vote by a court

Where and How to Register to Vote

You can register to vote online at <https://register.vote.org/?partner=781667>

- To register online you will need your Driver's License number, California identification card number, or the last four digits of your social security number, and your date of birth. (If you do not provide these you may need a form of identification or proof of residency at the time of voting)
 - California automatically mails ballots to everyone who is registered by **October 24, 2022**.
 - When you register, you can request to have your mail-in ballot sent to a different address, or you can do so later [here](#).
 - Voters who don't register by October 24 can still register and vote in person through Election Day.

Where and When to Vote

- The 2022 Midterm election will take place on **Tuesday, November 8th** 7:00am to 8:00 pm.
 - If you are in line by 8:00 pm you can vote even if it's later than 8:01 pm! (Don't leave the line)
 - California automatically mails ballots to everyone who is registered by October 24, 2022.
 - Voters who don't register by October 24 can still register and vote in person through Election Day. You can find the nearest place to vote at
- If you are returning your ballot by mail, it must be postmarked on or before Election



Day and received by your county elections office no later than 7 days after Election Day.

- If you are returning your ballot in person or dropping it in a drop box, it must be delivered no later than the close of polls at 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

 - If you lose or don't have your mail-in ballot you can vote in person by asking a poll worker for a provisional ballot.

Additional Information

- If you have already registered to vote but have since moved, be sure to update your registration at your new address.
- Under California State law, you are eligible for up to two hours of paid time off to vote, unless you have four consecutive hours to vote either from the opening of the polls to the closing of the polls. You may need to give your employer notice beforehand. Alternatively, you can vote by mail.
