



CEO Colorado - Voter Registration Guide



In Colorado, You're Eligible to Vote if:

- You are *not* currently in state prison or federal prison for a felony conviction.
- You *can* vote at the completion of your prison term. You *can* vote if you are still on probation or parole.
- You *can* vote and register to vote if you are in jail awaiting trial on a felony charge or if you are serving a sentence for a misdemeanor conviction.
- You can check if you're eligible to vote online at <https://campaignlegal.org/restoreyourvote>
- You're a United States citizen and a resident of Colorado and the county, city, or village for at least 22 days before Election Day
- You're at least 18 years old on Election Day
- You are not found mentally incompetent to vote by a court
- Due to voter rolls being purged, sometimes individuals who are eligible and registered to vote are removed. You can check whether you're still registered to vote at <https://verify.vote.org/?partner=781667>

Where and How to Register to Vote

To register online:

You can register to vote online at <https://register.vote.org/?partner=781667>

- To register online you will need your Colorado driver's license or Colorado identification card number (or, if you don't have either of these, the last four digits of your social security number) and your date of birth.

Vote by mail

- Colorado will automatically mail a ballot to all voters who complete the registration forms in time to be received by the County Board of Elections **at least 8 days before** the election. Voter mail forms received after that date will not receive a ballot in the mail, but they are still eligible to vote in person if able.
- If you do not receive a mail ballot or make a mistake, damage, or lose your mail ballot, you may request a replacement mail ballot from your county clerk. You may also vote in person at a voter service and polling center.



Where and When to Vote

- The 2022 Midterm election will take place on **Tuesday, November 8th**. All voters who are registered at least 8 days before the election will automatically get a ballot in the mail, and you can mail your ballot any time from the time you receive it until Election Day.
- You can vote in person or by mail before Election Day. If you registered at least 8 days before Election Day, you will automatically be mailed a ballot. Otherwise, you can find the nearest place to vote at <https://www.vote.org/polling-place-locator/>
- Mail ballots must be received by the county clerk and recorder no later than 7:00 PM on Election Day. Voters are encouraged to drop off ballots at designated drop off locations, drop-box locations, or mail their ballots in time to be received by the county clerk before the polls close. Postmarks do not count; ballots must be in the hands of the county clerk by 7:00 PM on Election Day in order to be counted.

Additional Information

- If you have already registered to vote in Colorado but have since moved, be sure to update your registration with your new address
- Under Colorado State law, you are eligible for up to two hours of paid time off to vote, unless you have three non-work hours available when the polls are open. Alternatively, you can vote by mail.
