



CEO Michigan - Voter Registration Guide

In Michigan, You're Eligible to Vote if:

- You are *not* in jail or prison after being convicted and sentenced for a felony or misdemeanor.
- You *can* vote if you have been released from incarceration, but you'll have to register or re-register.
- You can vote while on parole or probation.
- You *can* vote and register to vote if you are awaiting trial and have not been sentenced.
- You can check if you're eligible to vote online at <u>https://campaignlegal.org/restoreyourvote</u>
- You're a United States citizen and a resident of Michigan and the county, city, or village for at least 30 days before Election Day
- You're at least 18 years old on Election Day
- You are not found mentally incompetent to vote by a court
- Due to voter rolls being purged, sometimes individuals who are eligible and registered to vote are removed. You can check whether you're still registered to vote at https://verify.vote.org/?partner=781667

Where and How to Register to Vote

To register online:

You can register to vote online at https://register.vote.org/?partner=781667

• To register online you will need your Michigan driver license or New York identification card number, the last four digits of your social security number, and your date of birth.

Once you're registered, you can request to vote by mail with the form found on this page, <u>https://absentee.vote.org/?partner=781667</u>

 Requests to have an absent voter ballot mailed to you must be received by your clerk **no later than 5 p.m. the Friday before the election**. If you're already registered at your current address, you can request an absent voter ballot in person at your clerk's office anytime up to 4 p.m. on the day prior to the election, this ballot must be completed at the clerk's office.



Where and When to Vote

- The 2022 Midterm election will take place on **Tuesday, November 8th**.
- You can vote in person or by mail before Election Day. You can find the nearest place to vote at https://www.vote.org/polling-place-locator/
- If you vote by mail, the ballot must reach the Elections Office by 8PM on Election Day. (This means that if you plan to mail your ballot, you need to mail in your ballot early enough to reach the office by that time in order for your vote to be counted.)

Additional Information

- If you have already registered to vote but have since moved, you must update your registration with your new address.
- Under Michigan state law, no companies are required by law to give you time off of work to vote. Make sure to go to the polls either before or after your work shift on that day. Alternatively, you can vote by mail.
- You will be asked to show ID when you check in to vote. **If you don't have one, you can still vote.** See <u>here</u> for more information.
